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Lalaine was introduced to LIFT through Dr. Mae Corvera, a palliative care specialist and member of Greenhills Christian Fellowship in south metro Manila, Philippines. Dr. Corvera organized a seminar when representatives of Life Matters Worldwide traveled to that country in 2013. Lalaine attended and then her service to others really took off.

She thanks the Lord for training that gave her sensitivity to see needs all around her, and courage to reach out to help. “Because of the LIFT training, God put in my heart the passion and compassion [for] reaching people here in the Philippines. Wherever I go, there’s always an opportunity for LIFT.”

### *Joy in serving*

As a result of that first seminar, the Manila team identified more than 300 senior citizens who could be helped by the program. They also enrolled and trained some of the seniors to reach out to others in greater need. Participating in this “mapping” project, Lalaine was able to practice listening skills developed in training.

She also had the opportunity to care for her own sister before she died of kidney failure, and now ministers to her aging mother who suffered a stroke.

Even though, as a young widow with two sons, she has few resources, she’s determined to see LIFT ministries established in Baguio, her new hometown about 130 miles north of Manila. She’s begun home visits with 265 elderly people, 80 years old and above. Many are lonely, sad, and physically ill.

“The field is ripe and plenty, but the laborers are few,” she says. For now, expenses come out of her own pocket. Her prayer is that every local church and mission organization in the Philippines would use LIFT to impact hurting individuals and families.

### *LIFT and the Good News*

After regularly visiting and sharing the Gospel with an elderly cancer patient the woman prayed to accept Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Seeing that the end was near, Lalaine asked, “Is there anything you want?” The woman smiled and said, “I’m happy now. Thank you so much!” As Lalaine softly sang, “Because He lives, I can face tomorrow,” the woman smiled and took her final breath. Joy filled Lalaine’s heart.

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The pastor was impressed and she used the opportunity to stress the need for LIFT training. She says, “I think Baguio is now ready for LIFT.”
